“ I loved Chrissy Goth. She was a wonderful friend, and to this day, I think about her often. Even though we're both from the suburbs of Chicago, we met in Tucson, AZ on a dating site. I think my first message to her was simply asking "Cubs or Sox?" She responded "CUBS!"

We started dating immediately. We dated for a few months, but even after our romantic relationship had ended, there were times that we were inseparable as friends. We really enjoyed each other's company. We would sometimes talk about how we gave each other a sense of comfort, far away from where we both grew up. We were born within two months of each other in the same year, 1970. I was familiar with the area in which she grew up, as she was mine.

*Even after our romantic relationship had ended, we laughed *a lot* together. We would watch movies together over at my place (sometimes, the same movie multiple times over the course of several months), sporting events, etc. In 2010, even though she wasn't a big hockey fan, she was at my house when the Blackhawks won their first Stanley Cup in 49 years. The picture below is of a nightlight that Chrissy and I would turn on at night when we would sleep.*

We talked about our present and past work lives, our families, and our previous relationships. As friends, we were even able to talk about those people that we were currently dating without concerns of jealousy. She would sometimes spend consecutive days over at my house, perhaps longer, and it seemed completely natural. Her apartment was only about 5 miles away, and she would go home to check on her dog, or bring him/her over to my place.

Chrissy was really thoughtful. When my step-daughter was leaving for college, Chrissy gave her a blanket in which to take to school. That symbolism of making sure that someone's kid is warm at night will be with me for the rest of my life.

When Chrissy moved to Phoenix, and then on to North Dakota, we continued to stay in touch. We would randomly text or call one another to see how the other was doing, and to get each other's advice on various things, like what movie should be seen in the theater, etc. When either of us were visiting friends or family in Chicago, we made sure to reach out to one another to share the sights and the sounds of our favorite city. We didn't want to leave the other one out.

As a matter of fact, I can't begin to tell you how excited she was when she was able to get an area code 312 number for her cell phone. You would have thought she had won the lottery!

To me, Chrissy was a free-spirited person. I always thought of her as being on a search for something, hence the multiple addresses. Perhaps it was to find the next man she would marry, or a new city that she would enjoy living, or a new profession that she would take on - I'm not really sure.

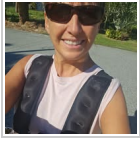

Finally, I vividly remember my first trip back to Chicago after Chrissy passed away. My Dad's health was in slow decline, and about 20 minutes from landing at O'Hare, all I could do was think about Chrissy and cry. I didn't have my good friend, my confidant, the person that I loved, to share my trip with me from afar.
