“ Colleen and I met in early 2001. I had left my phone number with the secretary of my children’s doctor. I told the secretary that if any other families came in with a diagnosis of sudden cardiac arrhythmias, (my husband had died of this and my children were showing signs of) to give them my phone number to them and possibly we could search together for information on the diagnosis which at the time had a little information available. A few weeks later, Colleen called me.

This was in late 2001, Colleen and I met a few times by ourselves and shared information. We did not get enough information however, because shortly after this, their son Adam died. Colleen and I spent hours on the phone, and met a few times, trying to figure out what happened to Adam and my husband, Mike, and we were instrumental to each other, in deciding the Implanted cardiac defibrillator question for and with each of our families. I had the pleasure of meeting Don, Andy, and Alex a few times after this. I learned that Don was as committed as Colleen to fighting what was causing these cardiac arrhythmias, finding a cure, and/or away to live with them. In the course of time, Colleen met other people who were dealing with this and reached out to their families. Together she and Don, held fundraisers for the Sads Foundation, aka Sudden Arrhythmic Death Foundation. She and Don were committed to trying to help prevent another family from going through what they were going through.

Colleen and I spoke on the phone quite a few times each year. Over the years we were able to see each other a few times. I was able to join them for their 25th Wedding anniversary celebration. I spoke with her many times as she was trying to work with Don on his health problems and their sons. Her love and dedication to Don and their family came through clearly in each and every communication we had. Between 2001 and now, there were so many medical emergencies that we became the lifeline for each other. I knew that as long as Colleen was keeping going, I could too. And I know she felt the same way about me. I will miss Colleen very deeply, and I

know many days I will think of calling her and reaching out or wonder why I haven't heard from her and then I will remember why.
