Frank Jaskowiak, age 93, of Lake Villa, IL passed away on Wednesday, December 29, 2021 at his home.

Frank was born June 4, 1928 in Chicago, the son of the late Francis and Pauline Jaskowiak. He spent over 37 years as an electrical design engineer at Commonwealth Edison and was a proud Army veteran, serving during the Korean Conflict.
