Jean was the life of the party, always ready with a cunning quip or some upbeat moves to her favorites--Elvis, The Beach Boys, or Elton John. And no one can forget her amazing cooking: Swedish coffee cake, Swedish pancakes, spaghetti sauce, and rhubarb pie are her most beloved dishes.

In 1997, Jean and Dick retired to Venice, FL, where she combined her passion for gardens and friendship with her desire to serve others. She was an active member of the Red Hat Club of Venice, Women's Sertoma Club of Venice, Our Mother's House, and a volunteer at Marie Selby Botanic Gardens. Additionally, Jean and Dick traveled the world, taking in the sights, gardens, cultures, and experiences each country has to offer. When not in Florida or jet setting, Jean and Dick could be found at their home-away-from-home: Hacienda del Mar in Cabo San Lucas, Mexico.

Jean is survived by her loving husband Dick, son Michael Maier, daughters Anne-Marie Maier and Kristina, (Paul Cook), grandchildren Andrew, Tegan, and Paige, and her sister, Peggy Sharpe (David Sharpe).
