Larry Laycock Jr., 54 of Lake Villa, IL, a proud veteran of the U.S. Navy, passed away suddenly on December 14, 2024. He was born on December 2, 1970, to Larry Laycock Sr. and Barbara Laycock (nee Heigel). Larry grew up in Lake Villa and graduated from Grayslake Community High School in 1988.

As a young man, Larry was involved in Scouts and earned ranks just shy of Eagle Scout, exemplifying his commitment to service, leadership, and perseverance. 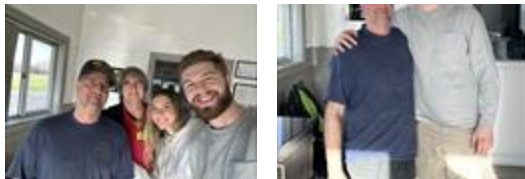
