“ Most of us would probably never think of you as a comedian Ryan, so when you invited me to come watch you perform at a comedy club I really wasn't sure what to expect. I was quite shocked by your lack of anxiety waiting to be called and then even more impressed by your calm, direct, satirical performance. No notes, just you, the microphone, and your dry, serious, sense of humor. The crowd genuinely enjoyed it all, as did I. What was surprising was you were just being a more open, more confident version of yourself as you poked fun at social and political issues. I remember telling you how proud I was of your courage, confidence and performance, because I would never have done what you did. I was so proud Ryan, that you seemed to have overcome your battle with addiction time and time again, and truly believed it would never beat you. But addiction is also a complex disease of the brain and body that too many of us underestimate unless we've experienced it for ourselves.
