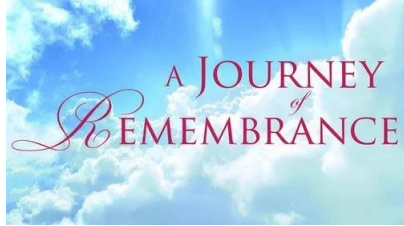

He drove me to school every day, never once did he ask me for a nickel for gasoline....he was going that way so why complicate a pleasurable experience? However, once I did lend him my collection of 8 track tapes (remember them)? I didn't see the tapes in the car so I inquired about the whereabouts. His answered was simple “They got stolen, “ “I drive you to school everyday so shut up!” Somewhere there is greaser from Prosser or a junkyard with my “Time, Peace” 8 track from the “Rascals” and a few others so I hope you enjoyed it, before you trashed it! Me? I just laughed at Sams' simple way of telling me never complicate a pleasurable experience with details; I chalked it up to the price of a ride, the next week I handed him a few more tapes and I said “See if you can get these stolen too or use them for bait.” Sam just laughed. Touché Spez. We kinda lost touch after high school, Oh sure there was an occasional softball game or drink at local bar, but for the most part we went our separate ways. Still I was happy to see him at the weddings or chance meetings, but for the most part, we were apart. I always thought Sam would wind up working at an automotive shop or a car dealership, making good cars better. To my amazement and as a testimony to commitment to hard work, he branched out, owned car lots and a fire extinguisher business, got his real estate license, dappled in buying, repairing antique cars and re-selling them, was a boater and outdoorsman, managed properties and sold real estate and was a gentle loving father to his fiancé daughter. Then again this really shouldn't have surprised me, our English teacher Mr.Waldoch, used Sam all the time as an example of how you can improve yourself through hard work. His progress was steady, if not spectacular. When I found out that Sam had cancer, I reached out to him, put him in our prayer chain, and I told him I loved him, along with Lord, he thanked me, and those were the last words we spoke, a simple answer from an uncomplicated man. His fiancé Randy, along with her daughter was at his bedside when he died, the loyal man surrounded by loyal woman. Saint Raphael is a blended church, combining furniture and artifacts from the predominately Polish south side St. John of God, and the predominately Italian north side St. Peter Canisius. How appropriate that the first burial from that church is transplanted south sider to the north side of Polish-Italian descent, Sam Genovese. His final prayer was that he would hold on long enough to be that one. I thought about that as antique roadster drove past me on Highway 45. The last simple prayer of an uncomplicated man was answered.
